

Writer Bill Newcott forged a writing career from the daily press to the national press to the elite press. His background is well suited to explore the odd, the old and the obvious that makes film so enjoyable. His picks in "100 Must-See Movies for Grownups" helps readers, young and old, recall that film didn't begin in the 1960s but stretches much farther back when directors depended exclusively on pictures in storytelling. This book makes a great gift for the cinemaphile and a good reference work for others. It's a fun jaunt through the movies.
